

## Åland

*Ålandstidningen* was founded by Julius Sundblom in 1891. It is the largest paper in the Swedish-speaking autonomy of Åland, located between Finland and Sweden (though part of Finland).

*Ålandstidningen* is politically independent, but it has a positive view of the autonomous system.

It is a local newspaper covering events, news and happenings concerning the Aalanders. Since Åland is a society highly dependent on what takes place in neighbouring countries, the paper also writes a great deal about international events that have some effect on Åland.
