Description of the events mentioned above for further information:

13th European Youth Culture Week

Date: 18–24 July 2010

Venue: Pecs and several other settlements in Baranya County

Organiser: Foundation for the Promotion of German Folk Dance Traditions in Hungary, German Minority Local Government of Pécs, Lenau Association

The European Youth Culture Week has been held every other year since

1988 in European cities whose traditionalist cultural groups (a musical band or dance group) have joined the movement. As of 1992 Pecs has been

represented by the Leowey Dance Ensemble which already hosted the event back in 1996. Participants: the Croatian Tamburica Orchestra (A), a South Tyrolean dance group (I), a Swabian dance group from Banat (RO), and one ensemble each from Latvia,

Lithuania, Germany, Sardine, Spain, Ireland and France.

Major events of the Culture Week:

- To go? To stay? – a one-day international conference on the conditions determining the future of cultural and linguistic minority groups in the EU.
- Games without frontiers – all-day sports competition.
- Common Market – participants present the handicraft products, food and drink specialties at the main tourist sites of their country at a one-day market in a frequented square of the city.
- International Photo Exhibition – presentation of the cultural values of the participating national communities.

Pecs–Ruhr Region–Istanbul Music Caravan at the ICWiP Festival

Music Caravan is the world music project of the Ruhr Region, Pecs, and Istanbul. This joint programme featuring various cultures of equal rank will lead to a musical event which will comprise the musical traditions of all three countries. This combination will result in a new “global sound”, a versatile and exciting musical production. The audience will have a chance to listen to the music created through the project at concerts held in all three cities.

2010 International Circus and Street Theatre Festival

Bridges Pecs2010 European Capital of Culture World Conference

Date: 24–28 July 2010

Venue: National Theatre of Pecs, Dominican House, Szinhaz Square, Promenade Square, and several other venues

Organiser: Pécs Cultural Centre

The Bridges World Conference – Mathematical connection between art, science and culture is held in a different city every year and is attended by mathematicians from the world's leading universities and by artists, teachers, musicians, computer experts, sculptors, dancers, educators, and representatives of companies developing pedagogical tools. The aim of the conference is to present the interdisciplinary connecting points, the so-called "bridges", and to popularise them among a wider public through interesting programmes. The predecessor of the conference is the Pécs – Ars GEometrica event, held since 2007 with growing popularity.

The conference program comprises lectures and workshops in plenary and simultaneous sessions. The works of the Bridges participants will also be exhibited. The structure of the event also provides an opportunity to share the scientific and artistic problems discussed at the meeting with the general public. Some of the speakers will present shows and different toys to the general audience at outdoor venues where anybody can experiment with them. Under the programme Art in Progress the public can also gain an insight into the creative work of artists and in the evening concerts and theatre shows will be held, accompanied by a series of multimedia presentations. The Bridges Family Day, which forms part of the event, will present opportunities to visitors of all ages to participate in various games related to the theme of the conference. Visitors will have the opportunity to solve a puzzle based on a geometric shape, a tool called Zome (which is similar to the Hungarian "Babylon" game) and the creation of eye-catching forms made of geometric models. Children and youth will be attracted by easy-to-understand and humorous popular science presentations by scientists and artists participating at the conference.
